Members' Display by Rick Kennedy

Since there was only one member display (Hallelujah Junction Quartz, by the author) this month, I'd like to take a moment to talk about Member displays versus the two Bragging Rights displays. Member displays are often related to the program, but can be just about anything, a cool rock you found, a recent piece of work you are proud of, a recent buy that you want to show off. All of these things work as a member display.

Bragging Rights displays on the other hand have a monthly theme. Some themes are pretty broad, but others are fairly narrow. If your display does not match the theme, there is nothing wrong with that, just put it in the Member displays section and you will get a few minutes to share what you have brought at the meeting. If you are bringing something to be judged, it should be something special, something that you are very proud of. Another very important thing in a Bragging Rights display is labeling. Since the entries are anonymous, you can't stand next to your awesome piece and tell everyone about it... it must have a label. And did I mention it must match the theme? I say this twice because last month, the theme was "Minerals" and boy did I see a lot of stuff that had nothing to do with minerals! It is always ok for you to ask for clarification on the theme and to ask if a certain display fits that theme. Some themes are easy, colors, etc. Let's say the theme is agate. Maybe that is not the best month for me to bring a mineral specimen or a jade carving for the Bragging Rights contest, but a collection of Mexican agate cabs or Lake Superior rough and cut is perfect. Most of this is common sense, but if you have questions, several of the members can help. And there is always the Member Displays...

Mineral Identification Clue #8 Fluorescence

Natural sunlight contains ultraviolet light, but our eyes cannot see it. When this ultraviolet light hits some minerals. It makes the atoms of the mineral release energy. We can see the energy. We can see the energy as color and we say the mineral fluoresces. Such a mineral under ultraviolet light is fluorescing in natural light, but the light is sometimes so bright that we cannot see it. So it is often necessary to be in a dark room before the "colors" can be seen.

The different colors that a mineral fluoresces are often caused by the kind of chemical impurity in the mineral. Ultraviolet light is made of long wave and short wave rays of light. Most minerals do not fluoresce. Of those that do, some minerals will only fluoresce under long wave and others only under short wave. The black lights people buy in the store to help plants grow or make posters shine are "long wave," Some minerals will fluoresce with a different color under short wave light than under long wave.

If a mineral continues to shine in the dark after the ultraviolet light (UV) is turned off, we say it phosphoresces. Usually it is only for a few seconds. Some minerals will phosphoresce a different color than they fluoresce.

Common Minerals That May Fluoresce

Name of the minerals	Color to Fluoresce
Calcite	red, pink, orange, yellow, blue
Dolomite	pink, cream
Halite (salt)	orange
Chalcedony	yellow-green, green, white
Barite	cream, yellow, white
Fluorite	blue, cream, yellow, yellow-green, purple
Selenite	yellow
Celestite	green-white, cream

Because fluorescence is often caused by impurities, not every piece of one of the "possible fluorescent minerals will fluoresce. But the ones in the above table usually do.

Rockhounder's Survival Kit

When I was young I was told this joke. Every time you go hiking, be sure to take a deck of cards with you. If you get lost you can simply find a place to sit down and start playing solitaire. In less than 5 minutes, someone will be standing over your shoulder telling you that you missed a play. If only it were that easy.

For years I have been hiking up and down mountains, across deserts landscapes, and through snow covered valleys. Sometimes I was searching for precious gems, other times an elusive deer. And on more than one occasion I was just trying to lose my little brother. I have been out for day hikes of two or three hours, and month long excursions into the Cade, Okanogan, and Rocky mountains. And although I have learned a lot of valuable lessons on these trips, one of the more important ones was that nobody plans to become lost, but sometimes they do. My first experience in this area was while a member of the Boy Scouts I went on a few search and rescue operations - one time even looking for those people who had become lost while originally being part of the first search party.

There are two basic rules to follow when you become lost. And it does not matter where you become lost, the rules are the same.

1. Survive and 2. Be Discovered.

There are some basic guidelines to follow to help you be discovered.

1. Tell someone where you are going and when you will be back. It is surprising the number of people who become lost and no one knows they are missing for days because no one know where they were and when they were supposed to have been back.
2. If part of a group: stay together: It is much easier to find a groups of people in the same spot than finding a single person who has gone to find help.
3. Stay in one area. Find a place safe to stay and do not wander.

4. Have a safe resting place - not a hiding place. Part of being discovered is being seen. Don't look for a place to hide, look for a place to be seen; a safe place, but as visible as possible.
5. Wear something bright. Bright colors are much easier to spot than natural colors. I do have a Hunter's Orange tee-shirt I wear or take with me. It is easy to conceal if needed, but also easily seen if that is what you need.
6. Stay comfortably warm. Not too hot, not too cold. So in the desert, stay out of direct sunlight, and when not in the desert, try and stay dry as moisture will cause very rapid heat loss even on relatively warm days.
7. So not lay or sleep on bare ground. There are a lot of reasons for not doing this, but hopefully the top three will persuade you. A. Heat: Bare ground will sap heat from you almost as fast as being wet.
8. Stay away from large rivers or lakes. This is on the 'better' safe than sorry' side of things. Remember, no one plans to get lost, well they don't plan to get swept away with the current or accidentally drown either. Creeks, ponds, and anything you can stand up in should be OK, but always be careful. Even small creeks can have some pretty fast flowing waters.
9. Don't eat anything if you are not sure what it is. This includes berries, mushrooms, roots, leaves, etc. Unless you know what it is because you come out and pick it every year, or you have had specialized training on eatable plants, don't eat it.
10. Be careful with any fire. Trust me, the last way you want to be rescued is by smoke jumpers and fire fighters. You think being lost is bad, add a runaway fire to the equation and see what you think. Take every precaution you can with any open flame.

As for survival: Stay warm, stay safe, stay healthy. As a scout I learned to always carry a survival kit whenever I was away from my primary campsite. Any survival kit has to be small and light enough that you will not feel it a burden to carry. Because if it is, you will not take the time you need it. A survival kit is simple to assemble and doesn't take up much room in a back pack or a day pack.

Other items not listed as part of the survival kit, but which you should always have with you when you go hiking:

- 1 compass
- 1 pocket knife
- 1 Map of the area
- 1 watch

This is not a complete list of everything that could be in a survival kit. I have one friend who has a master survival kit that has many parts and he only takes those parts needed for where he is going. So instead of a desert pack, forest pack, pains pack, he would have small bags of specialty items for each area and add them to the standard survival kit before he left.

Hope this is good information, would love to hear other peoples thought or ideas.
